



Quick Guide to Fire Safety for Rental Accommodations One-Two Family Dwellings in PEI

This checklist is for tourism operators of single-family dwellings (cottages) and duplexes rented as Tourism Establishments on Prince Edward Island. PEI follows Canada's National Fire Safety codes, as per the PEI Fire Safety Act RSPEI 1988 Cap. F-11.1 and associated Fire Safety Regulations.

This checklist will help you prepare for fire inspections and keep guests safe.

Pro tip: Hire licensed professionals (Licensed Electricians and WETT Certified Technicians). Keep receipts and reports for 5 years. Apply and receive permits proceeding with anywork!

1. Paperwork & Planning (Do this first!)

- Look around for risks (once a year): overloaded plugs, blocked doors, etc.
- Make a simple fire escape plan: draw exits, test alarms, list emergency numbers. Post it in your rental binder or on the back of the unit door.
- Save all records: inspections, permits, repairs—keep for 5 years.
- Check your insurance covers fire/electrical issues and ask for yearly code checks.
- Duplex owners: walls between units must be fire-rated (ask your builder).

2. Electrical (Get a licensed PEI electrician to check)

What to do	Why & how often
[]GFCI outlets in bathrooms, kitchens, outdoors, garage	Test monthly (push TEST button)
[]AFCI breakers in bedrooms	Canadian Electrical Code requirement since 2015
[] Smoke alarms (battery operated or hard wired)	Test monthly, check batteries, and make sure units are less than 10 years old.
[] Label breaker box clearly	Fill any blank breakers.
[]GetaCECcertificateafteranyelectricalwork	Keep it!

3. Smoke & CO Alarms (Save lives!)

- Smoke alarms in every bedroom and outside of the sleeping areas on each floor.
 Check batteries after each guest stays!
- CO alarm near bedrooms if you have gas/oil/wood heat or an attached garage.
- Test monthly (press button).
- Must be loud (85 dB) and work for 10 years (sealed battery OK).
- **Duplex**: separate alarms per unit, but they should wake up everyone.

4. Fire Extinguishers

- ABC 2.5-lb extinguisher in kitchen + near exits (one per 2,000 sq ft).
- Mount 3½-5 ft high, easy to grab.
- Check monthly: gauge in green, pin/seal OK.
- Pro service yearly. T & K in Charlottetown or P & G in Summerside

5. Escape Routes & Lights

- 2 clear exits (doors ≥32" wide, no obstructions in way).
- Bedroom windows open easily (no keys/tools, ≥ 3.77 sq ft opening).

6. Heat & Appliances

- Chimney sweep yearly by WETT pro (wood fireplaces).
- Space heaters: CSA-approved, plug straight into wall, 3 ft from combustibles.
- Dryer vent to outside, clean lint yearly, must be a solid sheet metal hose.
- No unvented gas heaters. Furnace/boiler service yearly.
